The Sacramento State Research Development Foundation is a collaborative of the Office of Academic Affairs and University Enterprises, Incorporated (UEI). It houses two primary groups, Research Administration and Contract Administration, and is also responsible for Centers, Institutes, and other research and service units for the University. UEI is the university auxiliary charged with accepting and administering grants and contracts on behalf of the University. The Research Development Foundation coordinates these efforts on behalf of the University and UEI and works to expand the applied and interdisciplinary research activities of the university community.

The Research Administration unit facilitates the development of grant proposals from University faculty and staff in support of academic programs, applied research and scholarly activity. Working closely with faculty, the unit identifies sources of external funding for research as well as for areas such as the development of curricula; training programs; the purchase of instructionally-related equipment; and for faculty to maintain currency in their respective disciplines. Unit staff works closely with faculty and staff in proposal preparations, including budgeting, editing, University clearances, and forwarding the final documents to the potential funding agency. Once awards are received, expenditures are administered and monitored for compliance with a broad range of state, federal and agency requirements.

Under specific guidance from the Provost/Vice President for Academic Affairs and in collaboration with the Faculty Senate, Research Administration also provides and coordinates support for research, scholarly and creative activities, and related travel. This also incorporates the University's Internal Review Board efforts with respect to human subjects review and animal care, as well as matters related to compliance, state and federal audit processes, and intellectual property issues. With the CSU system, the unit sponsors an annual research competition for undergraduate and graduate students and plays a role in supporting the dissemination of campus applied research and scholarly activities.

Working closely with the Research Administration teams, the Grants Administration group oversees the array of research and service contracts that result when external organizations, state agencies and the business community work with faculty, research and outreach units on campus. The Grants Administration group coordinates with the Student Employment Services unit of UEI and provides support for the administration of Trust Foundation accounts.

The Sacramento State Research Development Foundation is a public, non-profit organization staffed by professionals from the Office of Academic Affairs and University Enterprises, Inc.

OGE is responsible for managing all international institutional affiliations. OGE is responsible for ensuring compliance with all appropriate federal regulations and university policies governing inbound or outbound international groups and visitors. OGE also offers the following services to faculty:

International Students

International students from more than a hundred nations come to California State University, Sacramento to pursue academic programs. OGE administers a variety of programs (from pre-arrival to post-graduation) aimed at integrating international students into campus and community life, and providing them with ongoing support throughout their affiliation with the university.

Study Abroad

OGE staff administers academic exchange programs between California State University, Sacramento and universities in an array of locations including Argentina, Australia, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Japan, Mexico, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan and the United Kingdom. OGE staff also assists with advising and applying to the California State University International Programs. Study abroad opportunities are available for almost every field of study. Students pay regular campus registration fees and are not charged international student tuition fees. They receive CSU resident credit while studying abroad and may apply their normal campus financial aid. Information about transfer of credit from non CSU study abroad programs, leave of absence, scholarships, working abroad and alternative study abroad programs is also available.

International Programs pays all tuition and administrative costs for participating California resident students to the same extent that such funds would be expended to support similar costs in California. Participants are responsible for all personal costs, such as transportation, room and board, living expenses, and home campus fees. Financial aid, with the exception of Federal Work-Study, is available to qualified students.

To qualify for admission to the International Programs, students must have upper division or graduate standing at a CSU campus by the time of departure. Students at the sophomore level may, however, participate in the intensive language acquisition programs in France, Germany, and Mexico. California Community Colleges transfer students are eligible to apply directly from their community colleges. Students must also possess a current cumulative grade point average of 2.75 or 3.0, depending on the program for which they apply. Some programs also have language study and/or other course work prerequisites.

The College of Continuing Education (CCE) encourages lifelong learning by providing opportunities for personal and professional development. CCE's wide range of courses, programs, workshops, seminars and conferences are designed to connect campus with the community, meet the challenges of the workforce and address current trends in today's society. Through CCE, individuals have access to both credit and noncredit courses where they can expand their interests, prepare for promotion, enhance their skills or seek a new career path. Most courses do not require formal admission to the University.

CCE is also one of the top choices in the community for providing public, private and government organizations with training to improve employee effectiveness and boost their bottom lines. Course schedules are designed to be compatible with the time constraints and priorities of adults and working professionals and all of the CCE instructors are industry experts who offer real-world experience using adult learning methodologies.

Certificate and Professional Development Programs

CCE certificate and professional development programs offer specialized training in specific career areas. Programs are conveniently scheduled to be accessible for the working adult and can typically be completed in less than one year. This program is ideal for those wishing to explore the University environment, raise their G.P.A. or focus on a particular area of interest.

Osher Lifelong Learning Institute

Through a grant by the Bernard Osher Foundation, CCE is able to offer personal enrichment courses specifically for adults who are 50 years of age and over. Osher courses provide an opportunity for older adults to enjoy a learning experience on campus in a relaxed, non-threatening environment. Courses are continually updated but may include: theater, fitness, photography, travel, and a study of current events.

Winter Intersession

Intersession is a January program that enables students to accelerate their degree requirements, pursue an area of interest or reduce their class load for the fall and spring semesters. Students can earn up to six units by taking Sacramento State courses during this three-week class format.
