# **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

The fundamental purpose of the CSUS music curriculum is threefold: 1) to promote excellence in all aspects of music performance and academic coursework, 2) to provide basic preparation for careers in music, and 3) to promote interest in all musical and artistic endeavors at the University and in the Sacramento community.

The Music Department is affiliated with the College of Arts and Letters and offers the Bachelor of Music degree, the Bachelor of Arts degree, and the Master of Music degree. Majors are available in voice, piano, organ, all orchestral instruments, guitar, and theory-composition. A concentration in Music Management is also available. The MM may be earned with either an academic or performance focus. The Single Subject Teaching Credential may be obtained in conjunction with the BM or BA. The department also accepts students wishing to minor in music.

The main emphasis of the Music Department is upon performance. Sustaining this concept is the department's faculty, which remains committed to individual and ensemble performances as a means of enhancing the teaching quality of the institution and the cultural climate of the campus and community.

Students majoring in Music are not only expected to be technically proficient in the art but are required to have broad training in the liberal arts and sciences, which is the core of the University's program.

# **FEATURES**

With all of its degree programs fully accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music, the CSUS Music Department has developed a regional and national reputation as a result of the quality of its faculty and superior achievements of its students and performing ensembles. Each year the Music Department presents a large number of performances to the campus and the greater Sacramento area. These include concerts by the bands, orchestra, jazz ensembles, concert choir, chorus, and opera workshop. Now in its 23rd year, the Festival Of New American Music has become an important part of the musical scene in the United States.

In addition, the department has brought to the campus such notable personalities as composers Aaron Copland and Virgil Thomson; pianists David Burge, Ena Bronstein, and Daniel Pollack; author/lecturer Nicolas Slonimsky; classical guitarist Michael Lorimer; the Kronos String Quartet; The New York New Music Ensemble; and the Lew Tabackin Trio. A number of the music faculty have written textbooks; several are composers with numerous performances to their credit; others perform frequently.

After an initial session with the department's admissions advisors, the student will be assigned to an applied instructor for future advising. The advising process is greatly enhanced by the regular weekly contact between student and instructor/advisor.

Admission to the Bachelor of Music (BM) degree program requires the recommendation of the student's major applied instructor, a 3.0 GPA in music courses, and approval of the area applied faculty based upon a successful audition. Admission criteria and audition instructions may be obtained from the Music Department office.

Areas of concentration in the BM degree program are Voice, Keyboard, Instruments and Theory/Composition. Each area has unique course requirements. Students interested in a BM degree should discuss the details of the program with a faculty advisor in the Music Department.

# **Additional BA and BM Requirements**

The following are required for the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Music degree programs:

- 1. Upon entering the music major, each student is required to: 1) declare his/her major performance medium (instrument or voice); 2) perform an entering placement audition before the appropriate applied faculty; and 3) continue the development of his/her performance ability through regular study in accordance with departmental requirements. This development in performance is demonstrated at end-of-semester auditions before the applied music faculty. See applied music numbers for appropriate courses.
- Each student in the BA program of sophomore standing or above should appear as a soloist in at least one student recital or repertoire class each semester. Students in the BM program must do either a repertoire class performance or one student recital each semester.
- 3. As an ensemble experience, each student must participate in at least one large performing ensemble each semester. The following groups meet this requirement: symphonic band, concert band, marching band, opera workshop, orchestra, concert choir, or university chorus. Assignment to the performing ensemble(s) is to be made in consultation with the music major advisor and by audition. MUSC 142 is the appropriate course in which to register.
- 4. All undergraduate students majoring in music must have basic facility in piano to graduate from the University. For students other than keyboard majors, completion of MUSC 014D meets this requirement.
- Each music major is required to attend a minimum of 10 concerts and/or recitals each semester. MUSC 100 meets this requirement.

# **GRADUATE PROGRAM**

The graduate program leading to the Master of Music degree is designed to provide opportunity for a variety of advanced studies in music. The objective of the program is to produce a graduate student skilled in research, able in organizational and writing skills, and imaginative in developing new approaches and concepts: a student who, with a broad knowledge of the history and literature of music, is able to use this knowledge with effective musicality as a performer, conductor, or music educator.

The MM may be earned with either an academic or a performance emphasis. The program will effectively prepare students for continuation into doctoral study. Students may focus their studies in one of five areas: **Conducting, Composition, Music Education, Music** 

**History and Literature, Performance.** 

Further information about all aspects of the program is contained in the *Graduate Studies Handbook,* available upon request from the Music Department office. Prospective students are advised to request this document.

#### **Admission Requirements**

Admission to the graduate program in Music is initially granted with conditionally classified graduate status if the applicant meets the following requirements:

- a baccalaureate degree with a music major
- a minimum 3.0 GPA in the last 60 units
- satisfactory completion of the GRE Basic Exam
- two letters of reference (non-CSUS students)
- successful audition or composition portfolio review, if applicable

Fully classified graduate status is granted after successful completion of nine units of graduate work. The student must file for a change in status, using a form available from the Music Department's Graduate Coordinator.

# **Admission Procedures**

Applications are accepted as long as room for new students exists. Students are strongly urged to apply by April 1 for the following Fall or October 1 for the following Spring in order to allow time for admission before Computer Access Student Phone Entry Registration. All

prospective graduate students, including CSUS graduates, must file the following with the Graduate Center:

- an application for admission and a supplemental application for graduate admission (Forms A and B in the CSU application booklet); and
- two sets of official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended, other than CSUS.

Approximately six weeks after receipt of all items listed above, a decision regarding admission will be mailed to the applicant.

# **Advancement to Candidacy**

Each fully classified graduate student must file an application for Advancement to Candidacy, indicating a proposed program of graduate study. This procedure should begin as soon as the student has:

- completed approximately 15 units of graduate study, including MUSC 201 and two other 200-level courses, with a minimum of 3.0 GPA
- received approval from supervising faculty to enter courses leading to MUSC 500, Culminating Experience (see *Graduate Studies Handbook* for details).

Advancement to Candidacy forms are available in the Graduate Center. Instructions are found in Part II of the *Graduate Studies Handbook*.

#### **Optional Support Field**

From 3 to 5 units in fields other than Music may apply toward the degree with approval of the Music Department graduate committee. Students should have at least 10 upper division units in this field as preparation. Normally the supporting field units are on the graduate level. Supporting fields currently approved for music majors are Education, Humanities and Religious Studies, Modern Languages, and Theater Arts. In the case of Music Education, courses which are part of the credential requirements may not be included.

#### Foreign Language

A foreign language is required for the Music History and Literature Concentration. Students who plan further graduate study in all other concentrations are encouraged to take courses in French, German, or Italian, since proficiency in one of these is usually required in doctoral programs.

# **PERFORMER'S CERTIFICATE**

The Performer's Certificate is a post-master's level program designed to attract highly qualified instrumentalist, vocalists, and conductors. Instruction is at an advanced level for very talented and dedicated performers who have completed graduate programs or who are found acceptable into this program through a very competitive audition.

# **LOWER DIVISION COURSES**

**MUSC 001. Musicianship I.** A course in basic aural skills and practical applications of the rhythmic, melodic, and harmonic materials needed to perform, teach, and compose music. Class activities will focus around the musicianship skills of rhythmic reading and dictation, identification and dictation of intervals and triads, melodic dictation, contrapuntal dictation, harmonic dictation, and sight singing. **Corequisite:** MUSC 006. 2 units.

**MUSC 002. Musicanship II.** A course in advanced aural skills and practical applications of the rhythmic, melodic, and harmonic materials needed to perform, teach, and compose music. Class activities will focus around the musicianship skills of rhythmic reading and dictation, melodic dictation, contrapuntal dictation, harmonic dictation, aural analysis of form, and sight singing. **Corequisite: MUSC** 007. 2 units.

**MUSC 003. MIDI Sequencing and Notation.** An introductory course in computer-based synthesizer programming and control procedures and computer generation of printed music. Topics include basic MIDI principles, creating, performing, and printing music using computer-based sequencing and notation software. 3 units.

MUSC 004. Elements of Music. An introductory course in music theory and musicianship. No previous musical training is assumed. Course objectives are: to understand the meaning of musical notation and terminology; to acquire some skill in translating musical notation into sound and vice versa; to understand the rudiments of musical structure and syntax (rhythm and meter, scales and keys, intervals and chords, basic aspects of musical design) both on paper and as a listener; and to put these elements to some creative use. 3 units.

**MUSC 005. Beginning Theory.** A beginning theory course for music majors designed to provide a thorough study of the basis of tonal music. Includes scales, diatonic triads, melody, voice-leading, and simple harmonic progressions as well as correlative work in ear training and sight singing. **Prerequisite:** PC-DOS computer proficiency. 3 units.

**MUSC 006. Intermediate Theory.** An intermediate course in music theory that builds on the contents of MUSC 005. Includes stylistic analysis, diatonic seventh chords, modulation, secondary dominant chords, and simple formal structures. An aural skills

component emphasizes melodic and harmonic dictation of music associated with the harmonic devices studied. **Prerequisite:** PC-DOS computer proficiency. **Corequisite:** MUSC 001. 3 units.

MUSC 007. Advanced Theory. An advanced class in tonal theory that includes the study of enriched harmonic resources of the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries as well as an introduction to counterpoint and large musical forms. The aural component includes dictation and vocal reading of chromatic music and aural analysis of form. Prerequisite: PC-DOS computer proficiency. Corequisite: MUSC 002. 3 units.

**MUSC 008. Basic Music.** An orientation course designed to provide musical knowledge, skills, and competencies necessary for reading music or listening to music. Lecture and one hour laboratory. **Note:** May not be taken for credit by music majors. 3 units.

**MUSC 009. Music in World Cultures.** Designed as a survey of world music for music majors. Explores how music is used as a form of human expression in all cultures. Musical instruments, forms and styles, and the roles and functions of music in traditional and contemporary societies in various cultures throughout the world. 3 units.

**MUSC 010A. Survey of Music Literature.** A basic music literature course designed primarily for the music major. A semi-technical consideration of the various aspects of music literature for the primary purpose of stimulating broader understanding of all phases of music. Emphasis on listening skills. 3 units.

MUSC 010B. Survey of Music Literature. A basic music literature course designed primarily for the music major. A semi-technical consideration of the various aspects of music literature for the primary purpose of stimulating broader understanding of all phases of music. Emphasis on listening skills. 3 units

MUSC 012. Piano: Elementary Class Instruction. Elementary instruction in the fundamentals of piano playing. Open to all students beginning the study of piano. Recommended for elementary credential candidates. Sectioned according to ability of the student. Note: Not open to music majors. May be taken for credit twice. 1 unit.

MUSC 014A. Basic Piano for Majors. A class for the development of fundamental keyboard skills for the non-keyboard music major. Sectioned according to the ability of the student. Completion of MUSC 014D meets the departmental piano requirement. Prerequisite: Music major or minors and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 014B. Basic Piano for Majors. A class for the development of fundamental keyboard skills for the non-keyboard music major. Sectioned according to the ability of the student. Completion of MUSC 014D meets the departmental piano requirement. Prerequisite: Music major or minors and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 017. Voice Class.** Elementary instruction in the correct use of the singing voice and the development of style in singing. Open to all students beginning the study of voice. Recommended for elementary credential candidates. May be taken for credit four times. 1 unit.

**MUSC 018. Music Appreciation.** A basic music orientation course for the layman. A non-technical consideration of the various aspects of music literature designed to stimulate interest in all phases of music. **Note:** Not open to music majors. 3 units.

**MUSC 025. Voice for Music Theater.** Training in vocal techniques and repertoire of the modern American musical theater. May be taken for credit twice. **Prerequisite:** Instructor permission and proficiency examination. 1 unit.

**MUSC 027. Beginning Voice.** An introductory course in the art of singing with emphasis on the vocal mechanism and its care, use of the voice in ensemble singing and style in songs. May be taken for credit twice. 1 unit.

**MUSC 032A. Piano: Intermediate.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 032B. Piano: Intermediate - BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music degree program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 035A. Organ: Intermediate. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 035B. Organ: Intermediate - BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music degree program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 037A. Voice: Intermediate.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 037B. Voice: Intermediate - BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music degree program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 038D. Beginning Hand Drums. Explores the fundamentals of hand-drumming through two methods of study: the music of North India, the tabla drums and the rhythmic system of Hindustani music and rhythms of the Middle East through traditional drums, including the tar, riqq, and dumbek. 1 unit.

**MUSC 038S. Beginning Shakuhachi.** Elementary class instruction in the fundamentals of playing the traditional Japanese flute known as the shakuhachi. The focus is on fundamental blowing and fingering techniques, as well as the basis of the fu ho u notation system. **Note:** Open to music majors and minors; others by instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 039. Beginning Folk Guitar.** Folk guitar for the beginner, with emphasis on chords and strums as well as the playing of melodies. Guitars are to be furnished by the student. 1 unit.

**MUSC 040. Beginning Instruments.** Elementary instruction in the fundamentals of playing orchestral instruments. Designed to fulfill minor instrument requirements for music credentials. **Note:** Open to music majors and minors; others by instructor permission. May be taken for credit four times. 1 unit.

MUSC 042. Introductory Composition. Individual instruction in composition for the beginning composition major. Work will be designed to fit the preparation of the student, with emphasis on principles of sound melodic and harmonic construction. Original compositions will develop a mastery of the smaller forms. May be taken twice for credit. Prerequisite: Admission to BM degree program, approval by area committee and instructor permission. 2 units.

**MUSC 055A. Violin: Intermediate.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit

**MUSC 055B. Violin: Intermediate - BM.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Admission to the Bachelor of Music degree program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 099. Special Problems.** Individual projects or directed reading for lower division students. Open only to students who appear competent to carry on individual work. **Prerequisite:** Approval of the faculty member under whom the work is to be conducted and the Department Chair. 1-3 units.

# **UPPER DIVISION COURSES**

MUSC 100. Concert Attendance. Designed to develop critical listening, aural analysis, and the appreciation of a wide range of musical forms and genres. Each student will be required to attend a minimum of ten concerts approved by the Music Department and submit a portfolio of programs attended. Written reviews are required for a determined number of the ten concerts attended. 1 unit.

MUSC 100A. Concert Attendance. A class designed to develop critical listening, aural analysis, and the appreciation of a wide range of musical forms and genres. Each student will be required to attend a minimum of ten concerts approved by the Music Department and submit a portfolio of programs attended with comments about the music and performance. May be taken for credit eight times. 1 unit.

**MUSC 101. Experiences in Music.** Study of literature and curriculum in music for the child through grade six. Extensive experiences with songs, rhythmic movement, instrumental activities, music reading and writing, and guided listening aid the student in developing classroom leadership techniques. **Note:** Required for the Liberal Studies major. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 008. 3 units.

**MUSC 102. Scoring and Arranging.** A course dealing with scoring and arranging techniques related to the needs of orchestra, concert band, marching band, vocal and instrumental ensembles. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 007, PC-DOS computer proficiency. 3 units.

**MUSC 103. Counterpoint.** Study of the contrapuntal style and devices of the 18th century. Includes writing in two and three parts in such forms as the canon, invention, chorale prelude, and fugue. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 007, PC-DOS computer proficiency. 3 units.

**MUSC 105. 20th Century Theory.** Course deals with the harmonic, melodic, and rhythmic aspects of music from Debussy to present, with emphasis on the evolutionary nature of its development. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 007, PC-DOS computer proficiency. 3 units.

MUSC 106. Form and Analysis. A consideration of the development of musical forms from the phrase through the multimovement sonata and symphony. Emphasis is placed on the music of major 18th, 19th, and 20th century composers.

Prerequisite: MUSC 007, PC-DOS computer proficiency. 3 units.

**MUSC 107A. Composition.** Individualized practical experience in the composition of music in the smaller forms. Students are allowed freedom in the development of a personal music style. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 106, PC-DOS computer proficiency. 2 units.

**MUSC 107B. Composition.** Individualized practical experience in the composition of music in the smaller forms. Students are allowed freedom in the development of a personal music style. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 106, PC-DOS computer proficiency. 2 units.

**MUSC 110A. History of Music.** Chronological study of music's development from ancient Greeks through contemporary composers. Recordings and printed music are used to illustrate the development of musical forms and content through the various periods. **Note:** A working knowledge of musical notation is required. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 010A, MUSC 010B or equivalent. 3 units.

**MUSC 110B. History of Music.** Chronological study of music's development from ancient Greeks through contemporary composers. Recordings and printed music are used to illustrate the development of musical forms and content through the various periods. **Note:** A working knowledge of musical notation is required. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 010A, MUSC 010B or equivalent. 3 units.

MUSC 111. Tablature and Transcription. Course surveys the various guitar, lute and vihuela tablature systems that were in use from the early 1500s through the late 18th century. During this 275-year span no less than five separate tablature systems existed, each with its own table of ornaments. Students will be required to transcribe a modern performing edition from each tablature system. Occasionally the student is required to perform the transcription to see if what meets the eye meets the ear. 3 units.

**MUSC 118. Topics in Music Appreciation (Non-Majors).** Topics in Music Appreciation will be offered as needed. May be repeated for credit provided topic of course is not repeated. 3 units.

MUSC 118A. American Popular Music (1900-1950).

MUSC 118B. American Popular Music: Jazz.

MUSC 118C. Contemporary Popular Music (1950 to present).

MUSC 118D. Introduction to African American Music.

**MUSC 119. World Music.** An overview of music of Japan, Africa, Arab Middle East, Korea, Malaysia, China, Polynesia, Indonesia, and India. Recordings and films illustrate the uniqueness of this exotic music, presented in its cultural context. 3 units.

MUSC 125. Advanced Voice for Music Theater. Designed to give singers advanced training in vocal techniques, interpretation, stage presence, audition preparation, through the utilization of modern musical theater repertoire commensurate with the individual abilities of each class participant. Note: May be taken twice for credit. Prerequisite: MUSC 025 or instructor permission and proficiency examination. 1 unit.

MUSC 127. The American Musical Theater. A study of Broadway musicals. Examination of the music, lyrics, dramatic structure, and use of dance in selected shows which demonstrate the evolution of the American musical from its inception through contemporary forms. The course includes reading, discussion, listening assignments, and attendance at live performances. Prerequisite: Passing score on the WPE. 3 units.

MUSC 129. American Society and Its Music. An introduction, through reading, discussion, taped assignments in the Music Department listening center, live music in the classroom, and outside live listening assignments, to all significant manifestations of American music, their roots, and their place in American life. The course includes folk, religious, popular, jazz, and fine-art music. **Prerequisite:** Passing score on the WPE. 3 units.

**MUSC 132A. Piano: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 132B. Piano: Advanced - BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the BM degree program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 135A. Organ: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 135B. Organ: Advanced - BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music degree program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 136. Diction for Singers.** The International Phonetic Alphabet and its application to song literature in Latin, Italian, German, French, and English. Designed for advanced voice majors, others admitted by permission of instructor. Not offered every semester. 3 units.

**MUSC 137A. Voice: Advanced**. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 137B. Voice: Advanced - BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music degree program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 139. Jazz Improvisation.** A basic study of jazz improvisational techniques. The course will include jazz theory, ear training, keyboard harmony, and listening to recordings, with an emphasis on pedagogy. Students will develop their individual improvisational skills through extensive practice and performance. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 005, MUSC 008 or instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 142. Music Ensemble: Large Performance Groups.** May be taken for credit eight times. **Prerequisite:** Instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 142B. Concert Band. 1 unit.

MUSC 142C. Concert Choir. 1 unit.

MUSC 142M. Marching Band. 2 units.

MUSC 142O. Opera Workshop. 1 unit.

MUSC 142S. Orchestra. 1 unit.

MUSC 142T. Opera Theater. 1 unit.

**MUSC 143. Music Ensembles: Production Groups.** May be taken for credit eight times. **Prerequisite:** Instructor permission.

MUSC 143J. Jazz Ensemble. 1 unit.

MUSC 143O. Opera Orchestra. 1 unit.

MUSC 143W. CSUS Women's Chorus. A course for women interested in developing their vocal skills while exploring a wide range of choral literature for female voices. Various concerts will be presented as part of the general choral program of the Music Department. 1 unit.

**MUSC 144. Music Ensembles: Chamber and Small Ensembles.** May be taken for credit eight times. **Prerequisite:** Instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 144B. Brass Ensemble. 1 unit.

MUSC 144C. Chamber Singers. 1 unit.

MUSC 144G. Chamber Music — Guitar. 1 unit.

MUSC 1441. Chamber Music — Instrumental Jazz. 1 unit.

**MUSC 144M. Piano or Guitar.** Coaching in the performance of chamber music for piano or guitar with orchestral instruments. Open to both BM and BA majors upon permission of major instructor of applied music. May substitute for a maximum of two semesters of major performing ensemble requirement; may be taken twice for credit. 1 unit.

MUSC 144P. Percussion Ensemble. 1 unit.

**MUSC 145. Pep Band.** Performance of instrumental music for university and community events. **Corequisite:** MUSC 142W, MUSC 142B, or MUSC 142M, or instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 151. Fundamentals of Conducting. Basic techniques and skills of conducting. Areas of concern are all basic patterns in simple, compound and asymmetrical meters, correct baton technique, styles, appropriate left hand usage, tempi, fermatas, and introduction to simple score reading. 2 units.

**MUSC 153. Advanced Choral Conducting.** Choral techniques, including rehearsal procedures, score analysis, choral/orchestral repertoire, and approaches to choral literature from the main history eras. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 151. 2 units.

MUSC 154. Advanced Instrumental Conducting. Instrumental conducting techniques including refinement of basic conducting skills, rehearsal procedures, score study, and familiarization with and interpretation of instrumental literature. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 151. 2 units.

**MUSC 155A. Violin: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 155B. Violin: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 156A. Viola: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit

MUSC 156B. Viola: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 157A. Cello: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit

MUSC 157B. Cello: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 158A. Double Bass: Advanced. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 158B. Double Bass: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 162. Foundations of Music Education. A course for music majors considering a teaching career. Overview of the history, principal philosophies, current issues, methodologies and materials related to Music Education in kindergarten through twelfth grade. Guided classroom and/or rehearsal observations at the elementary, middle/junior high school and senior high levels. Required for the Single Subject Credential in Music. Prerequisite: Sophomore standing in music or instructor permission. Fall only. 2 units.

**MUSC 163. Band Instrument Technology.** Provides an understanding of all basic band instrument maintenance and emergency repair, concentrating on the instruments of brass, percussion, and woodwinds. **Prerequisite:** Instructor permission. 3 units.

MUSC 164. Music in General Education. Curricular and instructional strategies for non-performance music classes in kindergarten through twelfth grade. Teaching techniques for classroom instruments, with emphasis on folk guitar. Note: Open only to music majors enrolled in the credential program. Corequisite: EDTE 480A. Spring only. 2 units.

**MUSC 165A. Flute: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 165B. Flute: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 166A. Oboe: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit

MUSC 166B. Oboe: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 167A. Bassoon: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 167B. Bassoon: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 168A. Clarinet: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 168B. Clarinet: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 169A. Saxophone: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 169B. Saxophone: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 170A. Percussion: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 170B. Percussion: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 171A. Harp: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission.

MUSC 171B. Harp: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 172. Repertoire Class in the Performance Major. Parallel class taken in conjunction with the performance major to supplement student's knowledge of the literature, performance practice, pedagogy, and criticism of his chosen instrument or voice. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Permission of the instructor. 1 unit.

**MUSC 173. Accompanying.** Introductory course to piano accompanying with an emphasis on vocal literature. Includes techniques of sight reading, elementary transposition, and interpretation of lieder from the pianist's point of view. **Prerequisite:** Admission to BM degree program or instructor permission. **Corequisite:** MUSC 132B or equivalent. 2 units.

**MUSC 174A. Guitar: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit

**MUSC 174B. Guitar: Advanced** — **BM.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 175. Junior Recital.** Formal recital demonstrating the performance abilities of the student. Contents of the program must be approved by instructor in the major performance medium, and permission to enroll approved by the appropriate

faculty committee of the performance medium. **Prerequisite:** Admission to the Bachelor of Music degree program, or instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 176. Piano Pedagogy.** A study of the content, methods and problems of teaching the piano with an emphasis on the first years of instruction for both the child and adult beginner. **Prerequisite:** 4 units of MUSC 032B or equivalent; admission to Bachelor of Music program, or instructor permission. 2 units.

MUSC 177A. Advanced Composition. An advanced course in undergraduate composition for those students whose major emphasis is theory or composition. Includes work in larger forms, and more complex media, tailored largely to the individual student's interest and abilities. Prerequisite: MUSC 107A, MUSC 107B, admission to Bachelor of Music degree program, or instructor permission. PC-DOS computer proficiency. 2 units.

MUSC 177B. Advanced Composition. An advanced course in undergraduate composition for those students whose major emphasis is theory or composition. Includes work in larger forms, and more complex media, tailored largely to the individual student's interest and abilities. Prerequisite: MUSC 107A, MUSC 107B, admission to Bachelor of Music degree program, or instructor permission. PC-DOS computer proficiency. 2 units.

MUSC 178. Vocal Literature and Materials (Grades 4-12). A comprehensive consideration of the choral music program in the upper grades, junior and senior high including care and development of the voice, rehearsal techniques, and selection of materials appropriate for use in small and large ensembles. Note: Required for choral students and recommended for instrumental students enrolled in Phase III of the Credential Program. Corequisite: EDTE 481 (Phase III Student Teaching). Fall only. 2 units.

MUSC 179. Instrumental Literature and Materials. Methods and materials for beginning instrumental classes, orchestras and bands, solos and ensembles, marching band, and stage band. Note: Required for instrumental students and recommended for choral students. Prerequisite: 4 units in MUSC 040. Corequisite: EDTE 481. Fall only. 2 units.

MUSC 180A. Advanced Counterpoint. Advanced work in contrapuntal forms and techniques, including 20th century practices. Work will be designed to a large extent to fit the needs, preparation and interests of individual students. **Prerequisite:** MUSC 103 and instructor permission. 2 units.

MUSC 180B. Advanced Counterpoint. Advanced work in contrapuntal forms and techniques, including 20th century practices. Work will be designed to a large extent to fit the needs, preparation and interests of individual students. Prerequisite: MUSC 103 and instructor permission. 2 units.

MUSC 183A. Introduction to Electronic Music and MIDI. Introduction to electronic music and basic MIDI principles. Topics include studio set-up, principles of microphone and line recording, classical electronic studio techniques, analog and digital synthesizers, and fundamentals of MIDI interfacing with computers. No previous electronic music experience required. Prerequisite: MUSC 005, or instructor permission, PC-DOS computer proficiency. 2 units.

MUSC 183B. Digital Synthesis and Sampling. A course for students with previous electronic music experience who wish to gain more technical background. Topics include various principles of digital synthesis with an emphasis on independent voice construction, principles of sampling synthesizers, computer-based digital synthesis, and advanced MIDI applications. Prerequisite: MUSC 183A, or instructor permission, PC-DOS computer proficiency. 2 units.

MUSC 185. Senior Recital. A formal recital demonstrating the performance abilities of the student. Required of all majors completing the Bachelor's degree in Music. Permission to enroll by permission of the appropriate faculty committee. MUSC 185H or MUSC 185A may be substituted for 185 with the permission of the appropriate faculty committees. Contents of the program must be approved and supervised by instructor in the performance medium. 2 units.

MUSC 185A. Senior Audition. An informal program presented before a faculty committee and invited guests. It is designed to accommodate students who have special problems in developing their performance to Senior Recital level. Registration must be approved by the applied music faculty, and contents of the audition approved and supervised by instructor in the performing medium. 1 unit.

**MUSC 185H. Honors Recital.** The applied music faculty may designate outstanding performers for an Honors Recital. Contents of the program must be approved and supervised by instructor in the performance medium. 2 units.

MUSC 186. Musical Acoustics: Science and Sound. Physical principles of vibration and wave motion, with illustrations involving musical instruments and concert hall acoustics; principles of electronic synthesis, recording and reproduction of sound; operation of the human ear and brain in receiving and analyzing sound; relation of the harmonic series to sound quality, harmony and scales; proper roles for science in explaining music as an artistic activity. Cross-listed as PHYS 186; only one may be counted for credit. 3 units.

**MUSC 190A. Trumpet: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit

MUSC 190B. Trumpet: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 191A. Trombone: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 191B. Trombone: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 192A. Baritone: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 192B. Baritone: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 193A. French Horn: Advanced. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 193B. French Horn: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

**MUSC 194A. Tuba: Advanced.** Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 194B. Tuba: Advanced — BM. Individual instruction. Music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Music program, approval by applied area committee and instructor permission. 1 unit.

MUSC 195. Fieldwork in Music. Directed observation and work experience with public agencies. Fieldwork is offered for the purpose of giving students orientation in occupational specialties. Supervision is provided by both university instructional staff and cooperating agencies. Each student is required to maintain a record of activities and assignments and to prepare periodic reports. The student must make arrangements with a faculty member for a work program prior to admittance. Graded Credit/No-Credit. 1-3 units.

MUSC 196. Experimental Offerings in Music. Special upper division experimental courses will be scheduled as needed. 1-3 units

**MUSC 197. Music and Business.** An introduction to career possibilities in the area of music and business. Students will explore and develop directions of interest and opportunity through reading, discussion, lectures, and outside speakers. Individual field projects will provide the opportunity to see at close hand the workings of Sacramento area music businesses of the student's choice. 3 units.

MUSC 199. Special Problems. Individual projects or directed reading. Open only to students who appear competent to carry on individual work. Admission requires the approval of the faculty member under whom the work is to be conducted and of the Department Chair. 1-3 units.

# **GRADUATE COURSES**

MUSC 201. Introduction to Graduate Study. A systematic and historical study of the various disciplines related to music. Prepares the student to do advanced study and research. Required of all MM students in music. Must be taken the first time scheduled after student is enrolled. Prerequisite: An undergraduate degree with music major, or instructor permission. 3 units.

**MUSC 202A. Seminar in Music Education.** Study of current methodology in the development of reliable knowledge in the field of music education. Includes identification and formation of research problems, designing, and strategies. 3 units.

MUSC 202B. Seminar in Music Education. Review of current research trends in music education. Includes review of relevant literature and the definition, design, and justification of a research problem. 3 units.

**MUSC 203. Psychology of Music.** A detailed consideration of human reactions to musical stimuli. Production, transmission, and reception of music, the nature of musical talent and an evaluation of the several tests of musical talent and skill. 3 units.

MUSC 204. Music in America. A study of music in North America (with primary emphasis on the United States) from approximately 1620 to the present, including foreign influences and importations, the conditions under which music developed in a frontier society and the gradual emergence of a strong and independent musical culture. Includes a study of important performers, conductors, and musical organizations as well as composers. 3 units.

**MUSC 205. Music in the Renaissance.** A detailed study of topics in musical style, form, and composers of the Renaissance and their relation to the general culture of the period. **Prerequisite:** Undergraduate major in music or instructor permission. May be taken twice for credit with permission of the instructor. 3 units.

MUSC 206. Music in the Baroque Era. A detailed study of topics in musical style during the period circa 1550-1750. Independent research studies dealing with the music of the period. Emphasis on the works of Bach. Prerequisite: Undergraduate major in music or instructor permission. May be taken twice for credit with permission of the instructor. 3 units.

**MUSC 207. Music in the Classic Era.** A detailed study of topics in musical style, form, composers of the Classic era and their relation to the general culture of the period. **Prerequisite:** Undergraduate major in music or instructor permission. May be taken twice for credit with permission of the instructor. 3 units.

MUSC 208. Music in the Romantic Era. A detailed study of topics in musical style, form, composers of the Romantic era and their relation to the general culture of the period. **Prerequisite:** Undergraduate major in music or instructor permission. May be taken twice for credit with permission of the instructor. 3 units.

**MUSC 209. 20th Century Music.** A detailed study of topics in musical style, form, composers of the 20th century and their relation to the general culture of the period. **Prerequisite:** Undergraduate major in music or instructor permission. May be taken twice for credit with permission of the instructor. 3 units.

**MUSC 210. Composition.** Advanced work in composition for students seeking the MM degree with composition option. May be taken for credit twice. **Prerequisite:** Undergraduate composition and instructor permission. 3 units.

**MUSC 211. Pedagogy of Theory.** Discussion of the major disciplines in music theory, including the principles of part writing, harmonic dictation, melodic dictation, sightsinging and keyboard harmony. Practical application of these principles. Discussion of theories of pedagogy, past and present, and examination of various available teaching materials. 3 units.

MUSC 212. Evolution of Sonata Allegro Form. An advanced analysis course tracing the development of the sonata allegro form from its pre-classical origins through its use in compositions of the mid-twentieth century. Class discussion and analysis will focus on musical stability as a delineator of structure and function in the works of each historical period. 3 units.

**MUSC 215. Medieval Music.** Topics in musical style, forms, and composers of the Medieval era (c. 750-1350 A.D.) and their relation to the culture of the period. Individual research. **Prerequisite:** Undergraduate major in music or instructor permission. May be taken twice for credit with permission of the instructor. 3 units.

MUSC 217A. Choral Conducting Applied Music. Individual instruction. Graduate music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Note: Limited to choral conducting students only. Prerequisite: Permission of the instructor. 1 unit.

MUSC 217B. Instrumental Conducting Applied Music. Individual instruction. Graduate music majors only. May be taken for credit four times. Note: Limited to instrumental conducting students only. Prerequisite: Permission of the instructor. 1 unit.

MUSC 218A. Choral Conducting Techniques. Individual instruction. Training in technique and repertoire at the graduate level. May be taken for credit four times. Note: Limited to choral conducting students only. Prerequisite: Permission of the instructor. 1 unit.

MUSC 218B. Instrumental Conducting Techniques. Individual instruction. Training in technique and repertoire at the graduate level. May be taken for credit four times. Note: Limited to instrumental conducting students only. Prerequisite: Permission of the instructor. 1 unit.

MUSC 219. Graduate Applied Music. Individual instruction. Classified graduate music majors and graduate music credential candidates only. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Permission of the instructor. 1 unit.

**MUSC 220. Performance Techniques.** Individual instruction. Classified graduate music majors only. Training in technique and repertoire at the graduate level. May be taken for credit four times. **Prerequisite:** Approval by area applied music committee to enter performance option for the MM; permission of the instructor. 1 unit.

MUSC 285. Graduate Recital. Public recital demonstrating the performance abilities and musical maturity of the student. Content of the recital and quality of performance must be approved by instructor in the performance medium. Must articulate with MUSC 500B. Prerequisite: Permission to enter Performance option and approval of Music Department Graduate Studies Committee. 1-2 units.

MUSC 295. Fieldwork in Music. Directed observation and work experience. Fieldwork is offered for the purpose of giving students orientation in occupational specialties. Supervision is provided by both the instructional staff of the university and cooperating agencies. Each student is required to maintain a record of activities and assignments and to prepare periodic reports. The student must make arrangements with a faculty member for a work program prior to admittance to the course. Graded Credit/No-Credit. 1-3 units.

**MUSC 296. Experimental Offerings in Music**. A graduate seminar in music will be scheduled as needed. 1-3 units.

**MUSC 299. Special Problems.** Individual projects or directed reading. Open only to students who appear competent to carry on individual work. **Prerequisite:** Approval of the faculty member under whom the work is to be conducted and the Department Chair. 1-3 units.

**MUSC 500. Culminating Experience.** Open only to students who have been advanced to candidacy and have secured permission from the graduate coordinator. Three options are available: Graded Credit/No Credit. 1-3 units.

MUSC 500A. Thesis. 3 units.

MUSC 500B. Project (recital and paper). 1-3 units.

MUSC 500C. Second Recital. 1 unit.
